There is also the fighting between intact male cats over territory and mating rights – these injuries from biting and clawing can cause infection, abscesses and spread disease that can ultimately end in death. To that end, we always try to assist anyone who needs help to get cats spayed and neutered. Just this one simple surgery can do so much to end suffering in the feline kingdom. That part is up to us Humans – we need to be their advocates.

We truly appreciate all of you who have adopted from Angel Cat Pet Adoptions in the past, and those friends who support our little group financially through your tax deductible donations. We are an all volunteer non-profit rescue group and every penny of your donation goes directly to vet care, food and litter for our foster cats.
